# MSU DEPARTMENT OF MUSIC


Welcome to the Department of Music at Mississippi State University!

The Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching ranks our comprehensive land-grant institution as a Very High Research Activity University. Our Department of Music, part of the College of Education, is an accredited member of the National Association of Schools of Music.

We're proud of our new \$21 million state-of-the-art, 37,000-square-foot music facility that complements the Sills Band Hall. This complex includes classrooms, a choral rehearsal hall, faculty offices, sound-proof practice rooms, a recording studio, a recital hall, a student lounge and an administrative suite.

Our Department of Music comprises multiple interrelated areas of study that include band, brass, choir, collaborative piano, music education, music history, music theory, orchestra, percussion, piano, strings, vocal, world music and woodwind studies. Our dedicated faculty and excellent ensembles prepare our music students with skills they'll apply wherever they go. Our department offers the following degrees: Bachelor of Arts in music, Bachelor of Music in performance, Bachelor of Music Education and Master of Music Education.

Our faculty—nationally recognized scholars and artists—foster student learning and academic achievement. Our student-to-faculty-professional musician ratio ensures each student receives the individual attention desired in a professional setting.

## Concert Underwriting



In addition to a new beautiful facility, the MSU Department of Music is proud to be an All-Steinway School. While generous supporters gave many new pianos to our program, we seek additional gifts to update portions of our inventory and to build an endowment for annual repair and tuning. ## Student Scholarships

In addition, ensembles at MSU, which include the four choirs Cantaré, OPUS, Schola Cantorum and State Singers, the Famous Maroon Band, four concert bands, Jazz Band, opera, orchestras and numerous studio ensembles provide performance opportunities for over 1,000 student musicians on our MSU campus. Direct scholarships from \$100-\$20,000 or endowments over \$25,000 are integral in making MSU a premier music program.






